

Transformative Approach for Emptier to Entrepreneurs

- Increasing Access to technology, finance and business development services by Sanitation and Waste workers from National Departments & Financial Institutes
- BETB competency based skill development courses for sanitation and waste workers
- o DIFE Labor standard development
- o DoL inclusion of FSM and SWM in the **list of hazardous job** by GoB
- MoL Access to Labor welfare fund by Sanitation workers and their cooperatives from the Ministry of Labor



Impact Study


- Currently work with 3000 Sanitation and Waste Workers and their 50 Business Cooperatives in 10 Cities
- o Interviewed 176 workers (97 female and 79 male)
- o 60% through mobile and 40% physically
- Well structured Questionnaire and General Health (GHQ-12 tools)
- o Random Sampling

Impact on Waste and Sanitation Workers

- One person per three HHs has lost their job due to pandemic.
- 22%Income reduced by 41% at households
- Female waste workers have lost their job due to pandemic.
- 33.5% HHs could not manage three meal/day currently due to pandemic.






Occupational Health and Safety Scenarios

- Most of the waste workers have (81%)
 and are currently using (74%) mask,
 gloves and gumboots.
- However, more than half (51%) of the waste workers do not have sufficient PPEs (Apron, Sun glass, Vest, etc.)





Hygiene Practice of The Waste and Sanitation Workers

- Frequently-55%
- After any work-82%
- Before eating- **80**%
- After coming home from outside-72%

Frequency of washing hands of waste workers

Hand Washing Materials

- Soap/Liquid-soap/Soppy water – 96 %
- Sanitizer 28 %
- Both-20%

• **56%** are maintain social distancing

Response and Recovery

- Demonstration of Social Security Scheme (SSS) for waste and sanitation cooperative members
- Life Insurance Discounted Health Care services, Accidental and Casual coverage
- o PPE and Hygiene Kit support
- COVID Messages Digital Learning Sessions with workers and their cooperatives
- Support for registration and accessing vaccination services
- Demonstration of Hygiene Stations in settlements of waste workers
- Support for decentralized emptying technologies and upgradation
